Officer Reports

Finances – Becky Wolary and Maggie Howze

Committee Reports

Hospitality – Terri Erwin

- Next month work on picnic begins.

- Discussion concerning the extra expense from the April awards luncheon. This event is not really our function, but we are supporting the Extension Office. Thus, the expense is not our responsibility. Terri suggested that this arrangement needs to be passed along to the next committee head, since she did not know these facts.

Survey - Becky Wolary.

- Results to date: 39 completed out of 54 attempts. Of the 15 not completed, 7 were blank, 3 are duplicates of completed surveys and 5 have only the name information entered.
- Responses so far not great. Reasons for this are not apparent: everyone satisfied and happy with organization? Apathetic?
- At this point, the results are not substantial enough to draw any conclusions.

Education – Mary Ann Hindes

- Photography Workshop on May 6 had maximum capacity with 12 participants.
- Lavender Wand Workshop, June 25, had 11 participants. There was discussion about having another lavender workshop next year since response was enthusiastic
- The Arbor Workshop at Pinckneyville Park on July 9 had 4 participants.
- Upcoming:
 - Jessica Miller will do Making an Herb Container, Wednesday, October 8, at the Extension Office, 10:00 am 1:00 pm. Fee: \$28.00. This includes all supplies, soil and herbs. No fee will be charged for people who come to learn but not participate. Maximum number of workshop participants is 20 (not including observers). A discussion ensued concerning the location for this workshop, given the mess this session will inevitably create. Other venues previously were considered but none seemed appropriate for one reason or another. Additional venues were suggested by board members, including Vines and the Georgia Piedmont Land Trust's Kistner Center. Mary Ann will check with Jessica to see if the latter would work, since it's an ideal location in all respects related to the actual implementation of the workshop.
- Apparently, the idea of GCMGA sponsoring an Advanced Learning session has not met with a
 good reception by the state EO Liaison. Discussion followed about conducting advanced topics
 as GCMGA workshops without seeking to have them be considered as part of the statewide
 advanced program resulting in Silver or Gold stars. Jackie would like to see a training session on
 DDDI, an online resource offered by UGA that helps with species identification of plants and
 insects, among others. This could be added to a workshop on using identification keys. Another
 suggestion: Schedule a Propagation workshop this fall at Gwinnett Tech. Mary Ann should check
 with Robert Brannen as a courtesy.
